



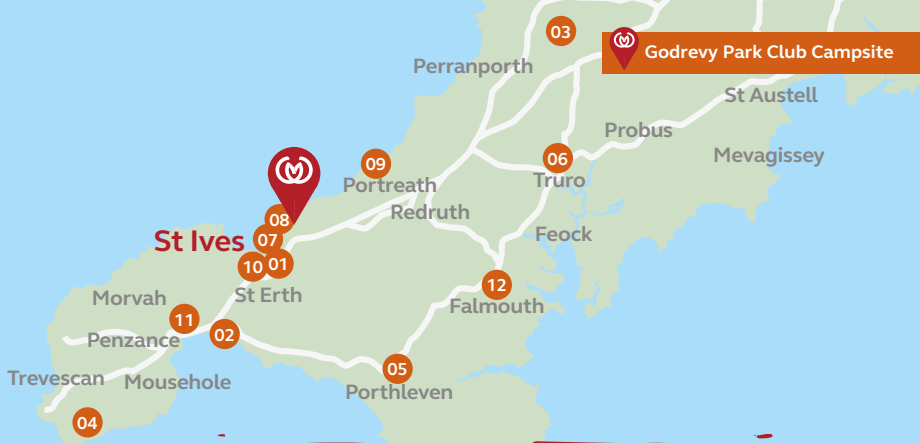

Falmouth's maritime legacy and coastal culture is a huge part of its charm boasting world class watersports and hosting sailing events such as Falmouth Regatta.

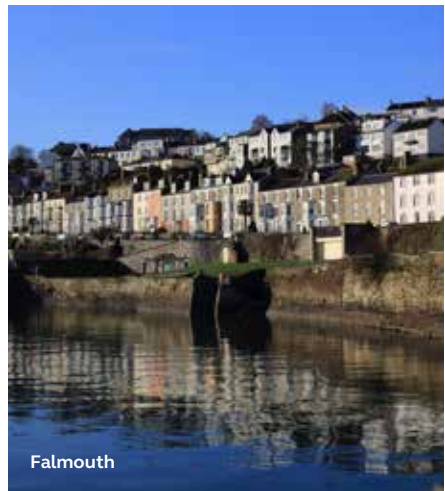
Cycle

The Coast to Coast Trail runs from Portreath to Devoran, through the Poldice Valley and Restronguet Creek.

|| Walk to Godrevy Point to see the seals basking on the beach.

Make sure you watch the sunset over Godrevy lighthouse during your stay.

Close by

Supermarkets

Lidl, 1.5 miles away, and Asda in Hayle, about 2 miles. There is a retail park, 1.5 miles with M&S, Boots, Next and Costa.

Swimming pool

Near Camborne, about 10 miles, or a Lido in Hayle.

Petrol Station

Dover service station is 1.7 miles away or Shell is 1.7 miles away.

Cashpoint

There is a cashpoint at M&S in the retail park, 1.5 miles from site.

Public transport

Train station, 2.5 miles and a bus stop, 0.5 miles, to Truro, St. Ives and Penzance. Park and ride train service from St Erith Park & Ride to St. Ives.
