





### 7 Calder and Pennine Way

The site is a good base for walking, with several leisurely walks close to hand and longer excursions that can take in the Calder way, Pennine Way and moors.

### 8 Hardcastle Crags

An enchanted wooded valley once known as “The Switzerland of Yorkshire”.

### 9 National Cycle Network

The nearest routes to this site are route 66, from Manchester to Spurn Head and route 68, Derby to Berwick-upon-Tweed (Pennine Cycle Way).




### 10 Halifax

Located on the River Calder, this charming market town is steeped in history and character, home to some of Yorkshire’s most famous landmarks.

### 11 Haworth

A picturesque village surrounded by dramatic scenery, this is a haven for independent shops, quirky cafes and fascinating museums; plus, it is twinned with Peru’s Machu Picchu.





## Visitor's top tips

|| The Robin Hood, The Hinchcliffe Arms and the Shoulder of Mutton pubs all serve good food and are dog-friendly.

Walk to Hebden Bridge along the canal (about 3 miles). Here, you'll find lots of lovely eateries, artisan shops, galleries and charming picture houses.

Visit The Piece Hall in Halifax, which has recently reopened after extensive renovations.

Mooch Cafe in Hebden Bridge serves great home-made food, coffees and even beers/wines.

The National Trust's Hardcastle Crags is absolutely beautiful, set in a wooded valley with a 19th Century Mill.

Aya Sophia Restaurant serves delicious, authentic Greek food in Hebden Bridge.

East Riddleton Hall is a wonderful day out; once a farming estate, with stunning gardens and great activities.

Walk up to Stoodley Pike (approx 5 miles) for fantastic views of the area.

Head to the Tibetan Kitchen in Hebden Bridge for healthy, fresh and tasty Himalayan-inspired meals. ||
